**An Enrichment Program for K-6**

**Purpose**

Lyon S.A.F.A.R.I. is designed to provide students who have completed Grades K-6 with enriching, challenging, and fun learning experiences in a variety of content areas. Recreational classes will also be offered.

In setting up the courses, priority has been given to activities not ordinarily done in the regular curriculum due to time and/or monetary restraints. The program is developed to provide a broad range of exposure, rather than a narrow focus on the child's favorite area of interest. It should be perceived as an enrichment boost for capable, motivated students.

**Description of Program and Orientation**

Students will sign up for 3 academic and 1 recreational course per session. Two sessions will be held. (Students must take different classes each session if they choose to attend two sessions). Session 1—June 2-13 (M-F) 8:30—4:30. Session II—June 16-27 (M-F) 8:30—4:30). Children can create a daily schedule that matches their very own interests and talents. Each class will meet for 1.5 hours each day. Lunch will be provided as well as two snacks. Students who have completed Grades K-2 may elect to take 1/2 day college. These students will sign up for (2 academic) or (1 academic and 1 recreational) classes per session. One snack will be included and, for an extra fee, lunch can be included in the 1/2 day program. They may choose a.m., p.m., or mid-day classes. (Students in Grades 3-6 may elect 1/2 day college if they wish to attend a Lyon College sports camp that may be offered on the same dates. The location for each class, as well as other specific directions, will be given at the orientation meeting which will be scheduled before the first class session. A mandatory Participation Agreement and Confidential Health Form will be completed at the orientation meeting also. **Requirements for Admission to Lyon S.A.F.A.R.I.**

Earning straight A's or being identified for a G/T Program is not required. Students displaying the following characteristics would benefit most from this program:

1. Students who have shown a strong motivation to succeed and/or desire to move ahead.
2. Students who are curious about the world around them and have a thirst for learning all they can.
3. Students who want to have FUN!

### **Steps for Enrolling in Lyon S.A.F.A.R.I.**

1. Parent must complete Sections I & II of the application form. Desired choices must be indicated on the form. Information left out of application will cause a delay in consideration. Remember, students will be considered on a FIRST COME—FIRST SERVED basis.

2. Mail or return the application with necessary fees to S.A.F.A.R.I. Program, Lyon College, P.O. Box 2317, Batesville, AR 72503-2317 or apply online.

3. Make checks payable to Lyon College.

### **Fees**

The cost to participate in Lyon S.A.F.A.R.I. is \$310 for one session or \$560 for both sessions. One session includes 80 hours of supervision (60 hours of instruction), 10 lunches, 20 snacks, and required camp insurance. Each student also receives a camp T-shirt. Extra T-shirts can be purchased for \$7 each. For the second child in a family, fees are \$260 for one session or \$460 for both sessions. Each child being registered requires a separate application (Contact [mcooper@lyon.edu](mailto:mcooper@lyon.edu) for the cost for additional siblings).

Students having completed Grades K-2 (only) can sign up for 1/2 day college. Price is \$170 for one session or \$300 for both sessions. These fees include the required camp insurance. For the second child in a family, fees for 1/2 day session are \$140 for one session or \$250 for both sessions. Student can have lunch served for an extra \$30 per session. Please mark on the application if you prefer to attend classes in the a.m., p.m., or mid-day. (Contact [mcooper@lyon.edu](mailto:mcooper@lyon.edu) for the costs for additional siblings).

Scholarship funds are provided by community businesses and civic organizations. Other discounts are also available (please email [mcooper@lyon.edu](mailto:mcooper@lyon.edu) for info). One discount per student, please.

### **Application Deadline**

Your application and fee must be received by May 16, 2008. However, we strongly encourage you to return your application as soon as possible as classes are filled on a first come—first served basis.

A letter detailing the status of your application and the date of the orientation meeting will be mailed to you by May 23, 2008.

### **Refund Policy**

You will receive a full refund of fees under the following conditions:

1. No more space is available.
2. Application is rejected by Lyon College for any reason.
3. Withdrawal of application is prior to May 16, 2008.

**Course Descriptions** (Classes are offered both sessions unless otherwise indicated).

#### ***Academic Courses***

**ABC FUN WITH COMPUTERS:** Come join us on an adventure that blends ABC's and computer technology. We'll create a book using the computer. We'll also play games on the computer dealing with our ABC's. **Grades K-3.** Taught by Erin Watson. **(CN2001).**

**A HOLIDAY FOR EVERY SEASON:** Every season has a holiday or two. We'll log on to our computers and study holiday traditions of our choice from around the world. We'll find out there's never a "dull" time of year! We'll use digital pictures and software applications to create a journal about all the information we discover. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Erin Watson. **(CN2002).**

**ANCIENT EGYPT:** Would you like to go on a boat ride down the Nile River, visit a pyramid, and see kings and queens and mummies? Then come joint us for a visit to Ancient Egypt! **Grades K-6.** Taught by Rebecca Caraway. **(CN2003).**

**BUTTON, BUTTON—WHO'S GOT THE BUTTON?** You will, if you take this class! We'll learn some basic sewing skills such as sewing on a button (a lot of them on our special project), how to hem a garment, how to repair a rip and many other useful tricks you can carry with you the rest of your life. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Rosanne Rogers. **(CN2004).**

**EXPLORE THE UNKNOWN:** Come with us into outer space and visit different planets and participate in fascinating activities. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Rebecca Caraway. **(CN2005).**

**FOODS AROUND THE WORLD:** Let's take a cooking safari around the world. Every day we'll visit a different country and explore the kinds of snacks that children eat all over the world. These experiences will fill your mind *and* body. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Charley Koch. **(CN2006).**

**GIGGLE POETRY:** Are you one of those who can't stand poetry? Do you think it's boring? Well, you need to join us and see a whole new and fun world of poetry from tongue twisters to rhyme poetry. These activities will give poetry a whole new life for you. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Carla Vredenburg. (CN2007).

**JUST BEACHY!:** Even if you can't get to the beach this summer, you can create beautiful art work like cockleshell critters, bug-eyed blow fish, and sand castles. Two separate classes offered—**Grades K-3 (CN2008) and Grades 4-6 (CN2009).** Taught by Reba Korkis.

**KITCHEN CHEMISTRY:** Find out all the cool experiments you can do using simple items from your kitchen **Grades K-3.** Taught by Rebecca Caraway. (CN2010)

**LATIN IS FUN!** Learn a new language that is thousands of years old! We will explore some basic vocabulary as well as historical and cultural information about a civilization that continues to impact our society in so many ways Latin is the basis for the medical, the scientific, as well as the legal professions. Studies have shown that students of Latin score higher on standardized tests as well as increase their vocabulary tremendously. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Rosanne Rogers. (CN2011).

**MATHEMAGIC:** Astonish your friends with amazing math tricks and stunts. You will read minds, predict the future, make numbers appear out of nowhere, and perform astonishing hocus-pocus. This class gives new meaning to the expression "math wizard". **Grades K-6.** Taught by Rosanne Rogers. (CN2012)

**MEDIEVAL SCIENCE:** Have you ever wanted to be a knight, explore castles, or do battle with a trebuchet? Come join us for this class and step back a few centuries! **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Rebecca Caraway. (CN2013).

**PHUN PHYSICS:** You will experiment with electrifying projects and inventions from recycled and low-cost materials you can find around the house. Take this course and greatly improve your perception of the world around you. **Grades 4-6.** Taught by Rosanne Rogers. (CN2014).

**SEUSS ON THE LOOSE:** Do you love Dr. Seuss books? There are so many to choose from. Come and join us on a journey of Dr. Seuss where we will learn many lessons through each story through numbers, matching games, rhyming, making choices, and many more. We will also make up some crazy crafts (how about a Dr. Seuss hat?). **Grades K-3.** Taught by Carla Vredenburg. (CN2015).

**SNACK ATTACK:** If you're tired of listening to your stomach growl, it's time to start cooking! We'll create some awesome snacks that will fight off the hunger monster and refuel and energize you to keep you going. **Grades K-3.** Taught by Charley Koch. (CN2016).

UNDER THE SEA: Did you ever wonder what is under the sea such as creatures and plant life? There are many things that you didn't even know existed. Come with us on an amazing trip that will be a splash of a good time by learning facts about sea life and making crafts that will keep you fishing for more. **Grades K-3.** Taught by Carla Vredenburg. (CN2017).

WHO -DUN -IT? Do you love solving mysteries? Do you love looking for clues that keep you hooked until the end? If so, come and join us in becoming a sleuth and see if we can break the case. **Grades K-6.** Taught by Carla Vredenburg. (CN2018).
